Hello Devon and welcome back to Our Devon News. It has been a few months since we've last published our newsletter and we have a lot of information to share.

It is hard to start a conversation today without talking about COVID-19 and the effect it has had on all of us. We've continued to be busy throughout this pandemic as we work to support our residents, while pursuing future development for our community.

Our newsletter will be having some changes in printing and delivery going forward as we continue to find cost-savings for our residents. We will now be publishing Our Devon News at the same time as our Recreation Program Guides with three issues per year going out in April, August and December.

Much has changed for our residents since this newsletter landed on your doorstep last December.

On Mar. 12, I stood in front of our business community, developers and leadership from across the region to deliver the 2020 State of the Town Address. This year's address focused on exciting opportunities

in land and economic development, clean energy and more.

By April, Devon joined municipalities across the province in cancelling events and encouraging residents to stay home as much as possible to help flatten the curve and prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Thanks to our frontline healthcare workers and the efforts of our residents over these past months, normality is starting to return to Devon. By continuing to follow the recommendations of Alberta Health Services, we will get through this public health crisis together.

Our staff have been working hard to provide programs and services to our residents and I invite you all to join me in thanking them for their hard work during these difficult and uncertain times.

Devon's COVID-19 Response

The Coronavirus (COVID-19) took the world by storm this year, presenting many challenges as the World Health Organization (WHO) declared a global outbreak of the virus on Mar. 17, 2020.

The Government of Alberta soon followed, declaring a public health emergency that same day and shortly after, the Town of Devon declared its own State of Local Emergency (SOLE) on Mar. 24 to support federal and provincial efforts to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Fortunately, the Town acted quickly to support those residents in need.

These supports included:

- Property tax deferrals – taxes due date changes from June 30 to Sept. 1 with no penalty
- Utility bill deferrals – allowing residents to defer Town utility bills until Sept. 30
- Assistance with grocery shopping and delivery
- Providing transportation to medical appointments within Devon at no charge
- Ensuring mental health resources were available to residents
- Supporting local businesses as they worked to continue to serve their customers
- Sharing regular updates on the continuously changing situation

Next Steps

At their Aug. 10 Council Meeting, Town Council debated if face coverings should be required when in public spaces in Devon. After a thorough conversation, Council has agreed that a bylaw mandating that face coverings are worn is not needed at this time.

Devon will continue to follow the recommendations from Alberta Health Services which strongly encourages the use of face coverings when out in public.

Council will be revisiting the face covering conversation again at their Sept. 14 Council Meeting to ensure they are still in line with Alberta Health Services and determine if this remains the best course of action for the Devon community.



Ball Diamond Relocation Promises New Development Opportunities in Devon

The Town of Devon is relocating the Field of Dreams (Devon’s south ball diamonds) this fall to make room for future commercial/industrial growth on the land at the corner of HWY 19 and 60. The proposed plan will see the ball diamonds moved west of HWY 60 to a parcel of Town-owned land.


The move was first proposed in February of this year when Devon residents and other stakeholders were asked for their feedback on moving the diamonds and what they would like to see in a new ball diamond development.

Following a public survey and open house, a final draft plan was shared with user groups and the community in late June. Overall, the final draft plan was well received and has now been finalized with construction slated to begin on the new diamonds as soon as possible.

The land formerly occupied by the Field of Dreams has been zoned for commercial/light industrial growth as part of Devon’s ongoing strategy to attract new businesses and residents to the community. The approach has already yielded results with 1960 Lumber and Hardware Company preparing to open on this land early next year for all Devon’s construction needs.
